Pope Francis has invited all Catholics and people of good will to join in this annual celebration: "This is the season for letting our prayer life be inspired anew, to reflect on our lifestyles, to undertake prophetic acts for creation. It's a time to call for courageous decisions and direct our planet toward life, not." The theme for the 2020 Season of Creation is "Jubilee for the Earth."
