13th Sunday in Ordinary Time: A story within a story - Today's reading is a story within a story. In his writing, Mark used this form of writing to develop understandings of who Jesus is by noting significant socio-religious dynamics of the day. Mark wants readers to interpret these two distinctive accounts in light of each other. By using a "sandwich" technique (or, intercalation) of writing. The gospel begins and ends with the story of the healing of Jairus' daughter, but in the middle lies another story. As a whole, the "sandwich" narrative gives light to faith and salvation, hope and healing, forgiveness and human dignity. Jairus, a synagogue official with wealth, comes begging to Jesus to heal his daughter. As Jesus moved through the crowd on his way to the home of Jairus, he was touched by someone. The "unclean" hemorrhaging woman would have been an outcast in society, and longed not only for physical healing, but also to be loved and accepted. Anyone touched by her would have been accused as well for being unclean. Yet, despite her place in society, she had such faith in the saving power of Jesus, that she reached out to touch just his robe, and she was healed. Jesus, in front of the crowd, responded to her faith and called her "daughter", equating her to the daughter of the prominent synagogue official. The story, then goes back to raising Jairus' daughter from death as Jesus lays his hands on her. Two stories, two different social standings, two healings: one touching Jesus, the other being touched by Jesus. The story as a whole shares with us that our faith in Jesus gives us salvation. Sacrament Connection Through the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, people receive faith, hope and love when they are very sick or dying. We can receive this sacrament anytime we are seriously ill. The sacrament helps join us to Jesus who knows how it feels to suffer. Sometimes people recover from their illness, but other times, the sacrament helps us prepare for our journey back to God. **(RCLBenziger)**

Reflection Questions: How can you bring about healing in someone's life this week? Is there someone you know who is in pain? Is there something you can do to help lighten another's load or give him/her courage?
