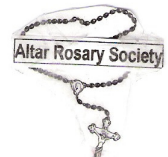

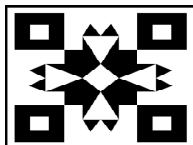

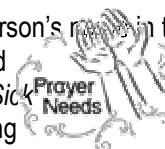
Do You Need A Break From Your Routine? Why not come enjoy fellowship with your community neighbors
