Reporting Suspected Abuse Takes Courage - When any adult in the faith community has reason to suspect that a child, young person or vulnerable adult is being or has been abused, he or she has a moral (and often a legal) responsibility to report those suspicions to civil authorities. Reporting suspected abuse takes courage. However, adults who take a stand and make the call are often responsible for saving a child or vulnerable adult from terrible torment.
