In today's gospel the Pharisees are trying to trap Jesus by asking him about divorces in marriage. Keep in mind that John the Baptist was beheaded when he spoke out against Herod divorcing his wife for Herodius who was his brother's wife. But Jesus answers by telling them about God's original plan of man and women marrying and becoming as one, and stressing that what God has joined, let no man put asunder.

Divorces cause much pain and suffering to the partners involved and mostly to their children but also affects the community. We have all seen or heard about marriages that must be ended for the safety of one of the partners or both, and most importantly the safety of the children. Surely God approves of this. 


Mission Statement for The Catholic Community of St. Stephen - St. Patrick

Over the next several weeks we will be sharing information from the Diocese concerning the sexual abuse scandal. We know that our faith is based on our relationship with God and that the wrong that has been committed is by humans....but with those humans being trusted members of our church it has had an impact on many of us. We hope that reading this document will help in understanding what the church is doing in regard to this situation. Information Regarding the Current Sex Abuse Issues in the Catholic Church From the Office of Communication of the Syracuse Diocese The revelations of abuse involving Cardinal McCarrick and the grand jury report from the Attorney General of Pennsylvania has reopened a wound that we had hoped had begun to heal since the 2002 revelations of past clergy sexual abuse and the mishandling of those cases. For most Catholics and non-Catholics alike, it has rightfully resulted in anger, distrust, shame, embarrassment and a sense of "where do we turn?" "Who can we trust?" We thank those who have been impacted by this abuse for having the courage to tell and retell their stories. It is through their stories that we begin to understand the devastation of this issue and truly begin to examine the Church's and the community's failure in handling this issue decade ago. The grand jury report is an investigation and a reporting of over 70 years of six dioceses. The allegations are horrific. Many of the allegations are of abuse that took place decades ago and some more recent. The Church has made changes and continues to make changes to prevent abuse. The Church has began an open conversation about the mistreatment of victims of abuse, mishandling of cases, misinformation and misunderstanding of the sickness of child sexual abuse. Victims in large part can now come forward to their loved ones, the authorities, the church and the public and know that there is a better understanding of these terrible circumstances and that they will be heard and believed. This was not the reality before the Church's crisis. Since the crisis first broke with the stories of clergy sexual abuse in the Archdiocese of Boston, the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People was implemented in dioceses across the country. In the Charter, it was mandated that a set of policies and procedures must be implemented in every diocese in the United States to protect children and hold people accountable for their abusive behavior.

Thank you to the community for all your outreach and support during this very difficult time. The service will be private.
