January Event For Life

Mass for the Unborn: Bishop Lucia will celebrate Mass on January 22nd at noon at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse for the legal protection of unborn children. This Day of Prayer is observed annually on the anniversary of

Roe vs Wade when abortion was legalized in our country. Individuals and families are also encouraged to pray, fast, give alms or participate in other events at their own parishes.

Mass and Holy Hour for Life: Bishop Lucia will offer a Mass and Holy Hour for Life on January 23rd at 9:30 AM at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception in Syracuse.

Syracuse March For Life: The Syracuse March for Life, sponsored by Syracuse Right to Life, will begin at noon on January 23rd at the Museum of Science and Technology (MOST) and end at the MOST. Masks and social distancing will be in place during the march. For those unable to march, the Cathedral will remain open after Mass and Holy Hour for private prayer during the march.

Responding to a call to care for the poor sick on the then Sandwich Islands, she devoted 35 years to caring for those afflicted with Hansen's disease on Kalaupapa, Molokai, Hawaii. On Oct. 21, 2012 Mother Marianne was canonized a saint. She is the first Franciscan woman from North America to be canonized, and only the 11th American saint."

Study: The Wild Goose with Fr. Dave Pivonka Spirit of Adoption, Lesson 7

"For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, 'Abba, Father!'" - Romans 8:14-16 The Holy Spirit reveals many things to us. One of the most beautiful is the Spirit revealing God as our loving Father, our "Abba - Daddy." Jesus related to his Father as Abba and never before had God been spoken of in such personal and intimate terms. God as Abba is a uniquely beautiful Christian revelation. The Spirit of Jesus desires to free us from fear and a master-slave relationship to give us a Father-Daughter or Father-Son relationship.

Listen: Stealing Home by Mike Sweeney the Kansas City Royals' player of the year Mike Sweeney is a devout Catholic and sought after speaker, has been involved with Catholic Athletes for Christ, has appeared on EWTN's Life on the Rock and has spoken at numerous Catholic venues. He appeared in five All Star Games and was the Kansas City Royals; player of the year three times. Starting from his account of an amazing play in which he stole home, Sweeney draws parallels to living one's faith well to the end.

Listen, There is Life in the Womb (Archbishop Fulton J Sheen) Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was one of the best-loved and most influential preachers of the 20th century and author of over 90 books. He reached nearly 30 million people through his weekly program, Life is Worth Living and his cause for canonization was officially opened in 2002. He explains the Church's teaching on life from a philosophical and historical perspective.
