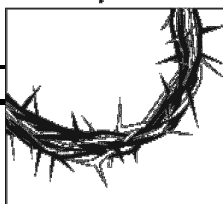

Holy Week Ideas for Families: Spy Wednesday - Search "Spy Wednesday" at catholicallyear.com for a fun activity!

Holy Thursday - Watch The Prince of Egypt - It covers the 10 plagues and the Passover! - Plan a Last Supper Dinner - serve lamb if you are able, or make a "lamb cake" or other item in the shape of a lamb, and break bread together. - Read Psalms 113-116 (or parts of them) while you wash each other's feet.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on June 19, 2020, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code").

The Bankruptcy Court has established April 15, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the "Bar Date"). If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Stretto, the appointed Claims Agent.
