30th Sunday in Ordinary Time -"Son of David, have mercy on me!" Today we hear a story of healing, but more than that, it is a story of great faith. To appreciate Mark's writing, let's put this event in context of the what is taking place. Bartimaeus, a blind man hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, and he calls out to Jesus using words of faith—"Son of David." Many in Jesus' time believed that the anticipated Jewish Messiah would be a descendent of King David. Bartimaeus recognizes Jesus as the Messiah. Jesus asks Bartimaeus, "What do you want from me?" Bartimaeus says, "Master I want to see." Jesus says, "Go... your faith has saved you." Throughout Mark's Gospel, the success of Jesus' healing power has often been correlated with the faith of the person requesting Jesus' help. For example, it is because of her faith that the woman with the hemorrhage is healed. Bartimaeus shows has great faith as he calls out to the "Son of David," and his faith has a response...he follows Jesus on the way. This particular reading today is significant as to where it is placed in Mark's Gospel. The reference to Jesus as the "Son of David," is found just before Jesus enters Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish Passover. Mark prepares us in this reading for the final episodes of his Gospel, which begin with Jesus' preparation for the Passover, his triumphant entry into Jerusalem and through the Passion.

MARY: MODEL OF APOSTOLIC ACTION

Luke 1:39 tells us that immediately upon hearing of her elderly cousin Elizabeth's pregnancy, Mary "went in haste" to visit her, showing Mary a model of compassionate companionship in action. This is the 10th article in our series. Please continue to watch for ongoing articles
